





Step 1: Choose from the 3 Cohorts:

Step 2: Download TTG Application form.

Step 3: Submit duly accomplished form to <u>ttgstudytour2016@theteachersgallery.com</u> on or before January 15, 2016. Due to the limited slots, application will be processed on a first come, first served basis.

Step 4: Accepted applicants will receive an email confirmation by February 1, 2016.

Step 5: Qualified applicants will be scheduled for a group visa interview as well as visa coaching. Our travel agency partner will be responsible for submitting the US Application Form DS-160 and payment of the visa application fee of US\$160.00. Applicants will be requested to fill in the information on the DS-160 and deposit the visa application fee to our bank accounts:

Step 7: Wait for updates re visa interview coaching and other announcements re the study tour program.

Step 8: All visas will be released to The Teacher's Gallery. Applicants will be asked to pay the Study Tour Fee upon visa approval which would include the purchase of Round Trip tickets from Manila to Boston, accommodations, school visits and the 5 day East Coast Tour.

Step 9: All applicants granted a visa will be asked to sign an Affidavit to Return to the Philippines upon completion of the Study Tour.
