Greetings from CYWTAC!

Multisensory techniques are frequently used for students with Regular Schools those with Learning Disabilities (LD) and Children with Special Needs. Multisensory teaching techniques and strategies simulate learning by engaging students on multiple levels. They encourage students to use some or all their senses to gather information about a task, link information to ideas they already know and understand, perceive the logic involved in solving problems, learn problem-solving steps, tap into nonverbal reasoning skills, understand relationships between concepts and information and store it for later recall.

Students whether in Regular Schools or SPED Centers typically have learning differences in one or more areas of reading, writing, math, listening comprehension and expressive language. Multisensory techniques enable students to use their personal areas of strength to help them learn. They can range from simple complex depending on the needs of the student and the task at hand.

Recognizing the importance of multi-sensorial teaching strategies to children, the Children & Youth Wellness Technical & Advocacy Center (CYWTAC), Inc. organized the 1st National Workshop, First of the Philippines entitled: **"Multi-Sensorial Teaching Strategies for Regular Students and Children with Learning Disabilities and Special Needs"** on **April 27-29, 2016 at Skylight Convention Center, Roxas St., Puerto Princesa City, Palawan**.
