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Republic Act No. 10648, which was approved on November 27, 2014 entitled "An Act Providing Scholarship Grants to Top Graduates of All Public High Schools in State Universities and Colleges (SUCs)" or the Iskolar ng Bayan Act of 2014 aims to promote the right of all citizens to quality and accessible education at all levels and to establish and maintain a financial assistance system that shall be available to deserving students, especially the underprivileged.

The academic scholarships provided under the Iskolar ng Bayan Program shall cover all public high school students belonging to the top ten (10) of the graduating class, based on the guidelines and criteria set by the Department of Education (DepEd), who will enroll in SUCs as freshmen, provided that they meet the admission requirements of the SUCs where they tend to enroll.

For this purpose, the government shall democratize access to higher advication by institutionalizing a college achidership program to be maned the "Isholor ng Bayon Program" for coppraduates of public high schools in the country, subject to the academic standards, application and admission policies and such other reasonable rules and regulations of state universities and colleges (SUCs).

SEC 3 Coverage — The academic scholarships provided under the "Ishotor ng Bayan Program", hereinsfier referred to as the Program, shall cover all public high school students belonging to the rop ten (10) of the graduating class, based on the guidetines and criteria set by the Department of Education (DepED) who will enroll in SUCs as freshment Provided That they meet the admission requirements of the SUCs where they totand to exroll in.

A public high school with more than five hundred (500) graduates shall be untitled to one (I) additional scholarship alot in SUCs for every five hundred (500) graduates. The additional slots shall be given to graduates whose ranks immediately follow the top ten (I0) students and who will enrull in SUCs after meeting the admission requirements for freshmen.

SEC 4. Admission in SUCs. Any public high school student who belongs to the top ten (10) bracket of the graduating class shall be entitled to the atholography grant provided under this Act in any SUC of choice upon compliance with the following conditions:

- (a) The student has graduated from any public high school in the country within two (2) years prior to the academic tear being applied for in the SUC;
- (b) The student has complied with the application requirements of the SUC;
- (c) The student's rank is reported by the public high school principal or administrator in a certificate bearing the name of the school and its location, the number of students, the rank of the student applicant in the graduating dises and other relevant information, and

(d) After taking the enurance examination in the cheen SUC, the student has obtained a rating which has been designated by the SUC as the minimum rating for a student to be able to gualify for the scholarship program

Provided: That for the next an (6) years in the implementation of this Act, beginning SY 2015-2016, admission to their SUCs of choice within their region shall be automatic for the top ten (10) areducing students of public high schools

SEC. A Limitation in the Acceptance of Top Public High School Graduates by SUCs - All SUCs shall provide scholarships to qualified public high school graduates under this Act: Provided. That the applicants have successfully passed the entrance examination and have compiled with the admission requirements of the SUCs.

The SUC, however, may have the number of students to be admitted under this. Act if the number of applicants eligible and applying for admission excesse by more than five percent (3%) the average number of first-time freshmen admitted to the SUCs during the first two (2) academic years preceding the entry of the apphoant.

The Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and the concerned SUCs shall establish the appropriate suidefines in the acceptance of top public high school graduates.

SEC. 6. Support to the Program. – The following government agencies/smittles shall provide support for the effective implementation of the Program.

I Government Agencies - these government agencies shall implement the following mandates:

- (2) Inform the CHED of their capacity to absorb the students applying under the Program:
- (3) Provide a summer bridge program, should the scholar fall to mest the coademic admission requirements for his or her preferred course, in order to enable the scholar to comply with the minimum academic requirements and/or allow the scholar to enroll in another course, and

- (4) Ensure that full assessment is granted to the scholars to enable them to exall of the Program
- II Local Government Units (LGUs) LGUs are encouraged to oxeate their own scholarship program.

The Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) is encouraged to submit an annual report to the SUGs in their respective province or region containing projections on employment apportunities and job openings.

- III. Private Higher Education Institutions (PHEIs) PHEIs are encouraged to create their own version of the Program
- IV. Private Corporations Private corporations are encouraged to support the Program under their corporate social responsibility projects.
- SEC. 7 Limitations of the Program. The scholarship grant provided under this Act shall be hanted to the full amount of thition and other school fees for the first year of college. Thereafter, the student beneficiary shall be covered by the regular student financial assistance and scholarship programs of the CHED. If qualified subject to the guidelines that the CHED may provide.
- SEC. 8. Reporterial Requirements of SUCs. Each SUC shall report annually to the CHED on or before a data set by the Commission. The report shall include the number of students admitted under the Program, the courses they are enrolled in their academic standing and other relevant information that will help improve the Program. The CHED shall also provide Congress a copy of the repura-

AN ACT PROVIDING SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS TO TOP GRADUATES OF ALL PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOLS IN STATE UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

We it enacted by the Senate and Hause of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - Thus Act shall be known as the "tskolor ng Bayan Act of 2014".

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. — It is the declared policy of the State to protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality and accessible education at all levels and to establish and maintain a financial assistance system that shall be available to deserving students, especially the underprivileged.
